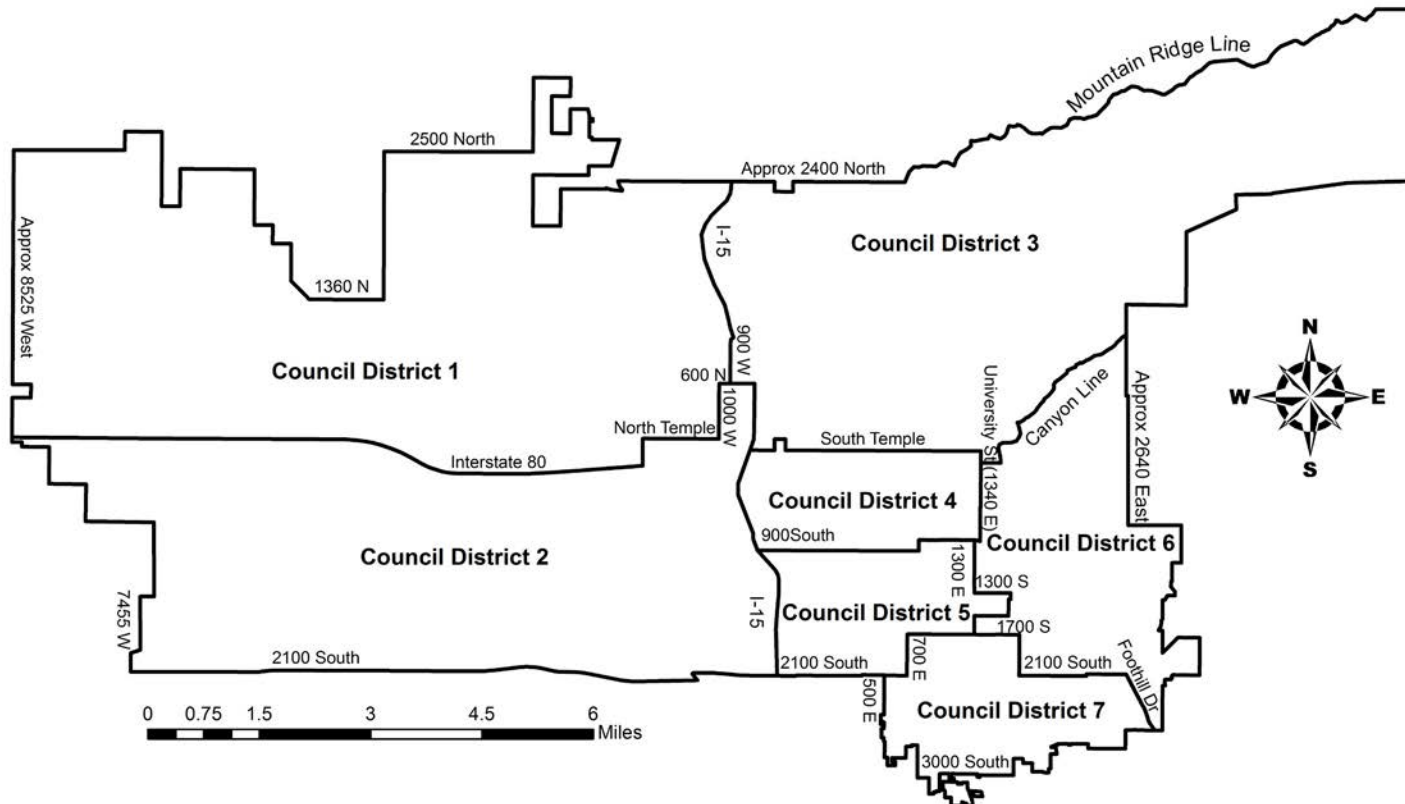

The Salt Lake City Council

Form of Government: Salt Lake City Corporation operates under a mayor-council form of government. All elected officials in Salt Lake City serve nonpartisan posts.

Seven part-time Council Members are elected to four-year terms from individual geographic districts. Each Council District has approximately 26,600 residents. The Mayor also serves a four-year term, following a citywide election. Every two years, approximately half of the City Council seats are up for election. The elections in Council Districts One, Three, Five and Seven are held during the same year; followed two years later by elections for Mayor and Council Districts Two, Four and Six.

The executive and legislative branches are equal branches of the mayor-council form of municipal government. The executive (or administrative) branch is comprised of the mayor and the following departments: airport, attorney, community and economic development, fire, finance, information management services, police, public services, human resources, public utilities and justice court.

The City Council sets the overall policy direction for Salt Lake City. This is accomplished by adopting ordinances that become City laws, adopting the annual City budget which determines what services are provided, and providing oversight of the executive branch.

City Council Meetings: Council Members exercise their legislative authority at Council meetings. City Council meetings are scheduled for the first, second, and third Tuesdays of each month, except for June, July, August and December when the meetings are held the first and second Tuesday of each month. Meetings are held in the City & County Building located at 451 South State Street, Salt Lake City, Utah.

WORK SESSIONS are generally scheduled at 2:00 p.m. in the Salt Lake City Council Committee of the Whole room 326, prior to each formal Council Meeting. Work Sessions are sometimes continued following the formal Council Meetings.

FORMAL MEETINGS are scheduled at 7:00p.m. in the Salt Lake City Council Chambers, room 315.
