

# **Stan Penfold**

## **Salt Lake City Council Member**

### **District Three**

In January 2010, Stan Penfold began serving his first four year term on the Salt Lake City Council. Stan was reelected by residents of District Three to represent them for a second four-year term in November 2013. He served as Chair of the City's Redevelopment Agency Board of Directors from 2013 to 2015. In January 2016, Stan was elected Vice Chair of the Council, a position he also held in 2011. Stan's peers on the City Council elected him to serve as Council Chair in January 2017.

A Salt Lake City resident since 1981, Stan is dedicated to public service. He is a former chairperson of both the Greater Avenues Community Council and the Salt Lake Association of Community Councils. During his tenure on those councils, his personal efforts led to the formal recognition of community councils by Salt Lake City.

Stan is Executive Director for the Utah AIDS Foundation, a role in which he has served since 1999 following five years as its Associate Director. During that time, he championed the foundation's extensive volunteer program and organizational processes.

Stan serves as a Commissioner for the Utah Commission on Service and Volunteerism. He also provides outcome evaluation training for nonprofit organizations. Stan is a past president of the United Way Executive Directors Association and has served on the National Library of Medicine Regional Advisory Committee. He is an instructor for the University of Utah Nonprofit Academy, and an advisory board member for the Human Rights Education Center of Utah.

An environmental advocate, Stan supports alternative transportation methods, as well as measures to improve air quality. He cites diversity as a key factor to community strength, and credits an economically vibrant downtown, airport and University of Utah as vital to Salt Lake City's sustainability. He envisions the City as "role model capable" in setting regional standards for smart growth, sustainable development, responsible energy policy, recycling efforts, the protection of open spaces, and green building practices.

Stan is a supporter of housing compatibility standards and has launched restoration efforts of a second home in Salt Lake City's Avenues neighborhood.

District Three includes neighborhoods in the lower and upper Avenues, Capitol Hill, West Capitol Hill, Guadalupe and Federal Heights. This north-side district is home to the State Capitol building, City Creek Canyon, the City Cemetery, the world headquarters of The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints, several hospital sites and three historic preservation districts – the Avenues, Capitol Hill and South Temple.
